


Old Boy's Association - STCML



An update by The Warden & Sub Warden

Overview of the year 2020 / 21

- Unprecedented two years.
- Students attended physical school for only roughly 2 ½ months each year.
- Classroom work, Clubs & Societies and Sports & games were all conducted virtually so the students wouldn't miss out on any part of their school life due to the pandemic.



O/Levels Results

- •The G.C.E. Ordinary Level exam results 2020
 - 93% of the 195 students qualified to follow A/level courses and only 04 students failed to do so.
 - 19 boys obtained distinctions in all 9 subjects and another 12 students obtained distinctions in 8 subjects and a 'pending result' for the aesthetic subject, while 10 obtained distinctions in 8 subjects with a credit in the 9th.
 - A number of the boys who did well are outstanding sportsmen.

A/Levels Results

- The G.C.E. Advanced level exam results 2020
 - 16 students received 'A' passes in all three subjects, while 15 students received 'A' passes in two subjects.
 - 75% of the 270 students qualified to apply for local universities.
 - The Island 9th (District 6th) (z-score 2.9372), Island 10th (District 7th) (z-score 2.9279) and Island 19th (District 9th) (z-score 2.4168) are all students from the College.
- The London Advanced Level 2021 results that have been the best in recent years since the London stream was started at STC.
 - 3 students obtained 4A*, 5 students obtained 3A*s and 3 students obtained 2A*s. Another 5 students obtained 3As and 6 students obtained 2As

Other Noteworthy...

 The majority of the students who completed the A/Levels in the batch, have received entrance in to local and foreign Universities / Institutes and are continuing further education.

 Only school to conduct physical training and sports training for all students virtually with the help of the sports Coaches

 Only school to not cut salaries of the staff. (Academic / Administrative / Tutorial / Support / Sports)

Cricket

The Royal Thomian Cricket encounter was conducted with great difficulty even after many of our players contracted Covid-19. Some were even diagnosed with Long Covid symptoms, but the match was played uninterrupted.



Rugby

- Senior Rugby team took part in the 7's tournament and adjudged Cup Runner Up. Thomians drew first blood, but the Peterites made a comeback to the game and snatched the lead.
- S. Thomas' faced Royal in the first semi-final and STC went into an early lead and continued their dominance as they ended the first half 21-nil and 21-12 at full time.



Choirs

•The Evensong of the Transfiguration and the Carol Service were both held virtually

•The OBA in collaboration with the Canto Perpetua Choir organised Christmas under the Stars

- Online Debating Competitions and Online Drama Competitions
- An online Video showcasing the Folk Music of Sri Lanka by the students of Lower IV to Lower VI
- Regular Webinars on Technology, Environment, Motivation, Current Affairs and prominent Social issues were conducted by a range of Clubs and Societies.
- Online Religious activities led by the Student Christian Movement weekly
- An Online Inter-house Quiz competition was held.
- Online camps, activities and regular scouting organised by the Scouts, Cub Scouts and Singithi Scouts.
- The Chapel Choir recorded a Choral Evensong that was released on the eve of the Feast of the Transfiguration
- The Classical Music Association organised an online talent competition from Lower IV upwards and many students took part to sing and to play instruments.
- The Culinary Arts Society organised a cooking competition for anyone who was interested to cook from home and send a
 recording of how it was done.
- The Productive Citizenship Society together with the Art Club organised an online Art Competition.
- The Interact Club donated face masks, gloves, protective gear, sanitizer etc... to the local police station in their bid to help the front line workers.



Ensuring students have a more interactive and engaging learning experience



The Smart Classroom Project

- With the help of donations from our Old Boys and proceeds from the Thomian Ride which was organized by the Class of 1982, College has been able to convert 20 classrooms to Smart-boards. These Smart-boards have helped to make teaching much more engaging for the students, especially in light of the current pandemic.
- Having conducted one and a half years of online schooling, the teachers have been able to produce
 wonderfully interactive lessons filled with animations and videos, and the need for all the classrooms to be
 equipped with Smart-boards have become not only a need but a necessity for the future of education at

 S.
 Thomas'.
- Through Walk A Mile, our goal is to equip the remaining 80 classrooms with Smart-boards, benefitting both teachers and students. Project estimated at LKR 32Mn to convert the 80 classes to Smart Classrooms.

The Pavilion Project

- College boasts one of the best and most scenic school cricket grounds in Sri Lanka. However, the
 requirements of our budding sportsmen of today have changed and as part of nurturing our school sporting
 talent, we need to provide them with facilities that spur on their flourishing while also ensuring that the
 College is on par with the requirements of modern sporting infrastructures.
- The new facilities will be world-class, designed not just to meet the needs of today, but also sustain itself for the future. Some of the features planned for the new Pavilion include Upgraded dressing rooms for home and away teams, ice bath and massage tables, unrestricted viewing for spectators, warm-up areas, dining facilities as well as women's facilities.
- The total cost is expected to be LKR 43Mn, and through generous donations we have already collected 23Mn. The balance 20 Mn to be collected thru **Walk A Mile**.

The project involves building four additional classrooms and a performing arts studio on the top floor of the new Senior Quadrangle building



The Senior Quadrangle Project

- This project involves building four additional classrooms and a Performing Arts Studio on the top floor of the new Snr. Quadrangle building.
- This phase is designed in such a way, that the premises, particularly the Studio, can be hired out to external parties which would generate additional income for the College.
- While construction was delayed due to the lockdown related closures of the past year it will recommence soon with completion time expected to be approximately 3 months.
- Est cost is LKR 20Mn, of which LKR 10Mn has already been donated by Class of 1979 and LKR 5Mn donated by the OBA. The balance funding requirement of LKR 5Mn is to be raised thru **Walk A Mile.**









The Guruthalawa Project


Through Walk A Mile, we will assist to raise much needed funds for projects to be carried out by STC Gurutalawa including new classrooms and other urgent infrastructure developments.

- S. Thomas' College Gurutalawa is one of the beloved branch schools of STC ML with a very strong bond between the schools maintained over the years.
- Most recently the OBA of STC ML in partnership with the OBA of STC Guru, helped initiate a Green Initiatives project aimed at ensuring sustainable development of the land in Gurutalawa which included a full drone survey and scientific study of land and areas most suited for Agri as well as Agri-sales promotion in CMB.
- Through **Walk A Mile**, we will assist to raise much needed funds for projects to be carried out by STC Gurutalawa including new classrooms and other urgent infrastructure developments.
- Fund raising task of LKR 20Mn has been taken up by the Guru Old boys, Parents, Students and well wishers. Through Walk A Mile we will enable our platform for Guru to raise their funding requirement.
